# **BIAŁYSTOK - A GOOD CHOICE!**

Białystok is northeastern Poland's largest city and the capital of the Podlaskie Province. Sitting close to the borders with Belarus, Lithuania, and Russia, Białystok is a very culturally diverse city and home to the inventor of the universal language Esperanto. The city is surrounded by numerous natural and historical sites. Among these is the UNESCO listed Białowieski National Park, the habitat of the European bison.



Białystok may only be middleweight in terms of size, but it packs a heavyweight punch when it comes to reasons to visit. Its main asset is undoubtedly its gorgeous natural beauty. Fields of sunflowers, stunning parks, enchanting forests, and lush vegetation have earned it the reputation of being a green city. Białystok looks set to become even greener: the government plans to increase its eco-friendly status by adding more green areas around the city. Even a few of the local bus stops had their roofs and side walls covered with plants.

Its fabulous blend of nationalities has forged an eclectic range of multicultural local customs and folklore. A massive cultural scene for people of all ages, a calendar full of sporting events, and buzzing nightlife all make a visit to the Podlaskie capital a good idea.

For centuries, the town's inhabitants have been forming a lively mosaic of religions and languages. Like nowhere else in the world, the domes of Orthodox churches harmoniously co-exist with Roman Catholic church spires. Living next to one another, Poles, Ruthenians, Jews, Tartars, and the Romani peoples inspired Ludwik Zamenhof, the inventor of the universal language, Esperanto. The Branicki Palace, one of the most stunning Baroque residences in Central Europe, is considered the gem of the town's historical heritage. The gardens which surround the palace are among the best-preserved garden complexes in Poland.



# **HOW TO GET TO BIAŁYSTOK**

The closest and most popular international airports are Warsaw Chopin Airport and Warsaw Modlin Airport, both located approximately 200 km from Bialystok.

# **HOW TO APPLY**

Once you have been nominated by your home university, you can apply to study at the University of Bialystok. Before arrival you need to send by e-mail, fax or post the following documents:

- Application Form duly signed and stamped
- Learning Agreement accepted by coordinators of both sides

- Winter Semester 31 May
- Summer Semester 31th October

# **COSTS OF LIVING COSTS OF LIVING**

The cost of living in Bialystok is slightly lower than in other big cities in Poland. The monthly cost of living per one student is approximately 1300-1600 PLN (310-385 EUR).

1 EUR = approximately 4.30 PLN

The average cost of monthly living should be divided into:

- accommodation in the student's dormitory: 360 PLN-410 PLN (85 EUR-100 EUR);
- monthly food costs: approx. 800 PLN (170 EUR);
- transport: approx. 60 PLN (20 EUR);
- leisure, books: approx. 300 PLN (70 EUR).

Polish student ID card authorizes to 50% discount for public transport.

# LEISURE IN BIAŁYSTOK

Whether on foot, walking with hiking sticks, horse-back, by bike or kayaking – any form of active leisure is good to explore the charms of the Podlaskie Region. Enthusiasts of various sports disciplines, including extreme sports, will find a lot of place throughout the region to vent their energy in every season of the year.

Many trails crossing the forests of the Podlaskie Region invite you to practice walking tourism and Nordic walking. Walking along marked paths of the Nordic Walking Park "The Land of Forest and European Bison," you will have the opportunities to see charming Podlaskie villages, hundred-year-old stands of trees and forest clearings of the Białowieża Forest. Attractive equestrian trails lead through the Knyszyn and Augustów Forests.

You can watch the landscapes of the Biebrza and the Narew river backwaters from above during a balloon ride or take a closer look kayaking. In this way, you can enjoy the beauty of nature and admire the unique wooden architecture of Podlaskie villages. Many natural and artificial lakes offer a lot of opportunities to practice water sports. Modern water ski lifts and equipment hire are available in Augustów, Szelment, and Wasilków. Active leisure

enthusiasts will certainly find other attractions in the area.




Rope parks, climbing walls and paintball grounds offer extreme sports experience. Off-road riding enthusiasts will feel their adrenaline going high on muddy and jumpy off-road trails.

If you are brave enough, you can get into a ball to experience

zorbing. Recreation centres (e.g. WOSiR Szelment), air clubs and many private organisers offer extreme sports opportunities in the Podlaskie Region.

In the winter, the region is a tourist destination for skiers and snowboarders. Modern ski lifts and snowmaking systems operate near Suwałki on Jesionowa Hill. You can also dive into snow frenzy near Łomża, with ski runs that are 1500 m long. Białystok invites you to picturesque trails suitable for cross-country skiing, and to the indoor ice rink in BOSiR.
